The Biennial was originally due to take place in September 25 1991. Unfortunately, the space I wanted to secure for the Biennial would not have been ready by then, in which case we would have to realize the Biennial in unsavory spaces around the city- which as you know, because of the traffic becomes a real problem. Also, a city like Istanbul, deserves a major Biennial, which would also stir the excitement towards a contemporary museum. The crisis in the Gulf also proved to be a major strain on sponsorship. our .

Aillart I believe that a 12 month delay is worth what I will be able to organize. People in Turkey like to act hastily and may not exactly condone my decision in this matter. Be that as it may, I would rather see a tightly organized exemplary exhibition, rather than one scattered all around the city done solely for the sake of being on time.

I was very lucky to have met with you. because I was originally dead worried about the Soviet participation. Now that I know, we speak in similar languages, your participation will be of top of quality and with genuine intentions.

I look forward to your reply. Best wishes and continuing success in your work.
